Building name	Church of St James the Great		
Address	Church of St James the Great, Church Road, Haydock, WA11 0NJ		
Description	<p>A single storey brown brick building in the Gothic style with stone mullion windows and slate roof. The building displays two 18th century wall tablets of former 'Haydock Linen Charity' with inscription including dates 1650-1728 and 1731-1794 respectively. The original church was constructed in 1866 by George Harris of St Helens and designed by W and J Hay, this later became the north aisle of the second church. The now standing main portion was added in 1899 by Douglas and Fordsham (an architectural partnership that worked on many buildings and churches across the NorthWest). Due to mining subsidence, by 1925 it was in ruinous condition and had to be completely restored. The rebuild was completed in 1931 by J Dod. The open roof and wide nave have a framework of deep oak and light coloured plaster. The church was re-opened in 1931, with a new altar by W.R Burden, and a flat roofed chancel to distinguish it from the arched nave. The latter is wide with a clerestory.</p>

Description			
<p>Built on the land of Haydock Stocks the current building is an 1896 rebuild of an earlier public house. This substantial two storey building is built of red brick with terracotta embellishment, it is Georgian revival in style, featuring a pediment and decorative parapets to the main elevations along with tall ornate chimneys and arched ground floor windows.</p>

Building name	Former Providence Baptist Church

Description			
<p>Built in 1876, the stone inscription at the front of the building reads 'Providence District Baptist Chapel 1876'. The building is constructed of brick with a slate roof. There are two arched windows either side of the doorway on the front elevation and two arched windows on both the east and north elevations. These all share the same decorative brickwork features as the main doorway. The building has fallen into a poor state of repair in recent years however still retains many of its original features.</p>

Description			
<p>Dating back to 1846 this building displays quite severe architectural style with tripartite lancet windows to front elevation over central doorway. Brick facing with stone detail. Slate roof. Hall/school room located to the right of front elevation, possibly later addition. Permission was granted for this church to be converted into a funeral directors in 2014. Despite this the main body of the building has been retained and its character preserved.</p>

Building name	Haydock War Memorial and Former Public Library

Description			
<p>Originally built as a war memorial to commemorate the First World War, this brick-built structure with sandstone detailing now forms part of Haydock Sports College, most recently used as an art block and having previously been a library. Construction began in 1931 using the designs of Stephen Wilkinson (a Lancashire County Architect) which was instructed by Haydock War Memorial Committee. The memorial was built on land donated by Lord Newton of the Legh Family.</p>

Description			
<p>A date stone in the centre of the building reads 1864 AD. This symmetrical semi-detached building is set back from the road by a large open garden and within the open countryside which emphasises its grandeur. It is situated to the north of Pewfall Colliery. The buildings are in an area of disused mine shafts with a large pond to the south-east which a path / track adjacent to the properties passes past. The two storey sandstone building is complete with quoins, slate roof and brick chimneys. It is thought that there may be links to Pewfall Colliery and its owners / managers however there is no evidence to prove this.</p>

Description	<p>This former crossing keepers house is a small single storey brick building. There was no building shown on the site on the 1st edition 6" OS map of 1849. The 1st edition 25" OS map of 1894 shows the building beside the crossing of the tramway. While the building has been extended to the rear with a timber lean-to structure, its appearance when viewed from the road remains intact and as such the building retains much of its character.</p>

Description			
<p>The school was officially opened in 1932 by Director of Education for Lancashire, Sir Percy Meadon. There were two quite distinct departments - one for boys, the other for girls. An invisible line was drawn between these departments, between classrooms 14 and 15, and neither staff nor students crossed it. Children were drawn from three junior schools - Richard Evans (known then as 'Jaggers', after the name of a former Headmaster), the Colliery School (also known as 'Taylor's' after a former Headmaster) and St. James. Shortly after the outbreak of war in 1939 many of the male staff joined the forces and were temporarily replaced by women. Only two men returned - Mr Beale and Mr Bell (who later became Headmaster). In the summer of 1941, the school was closed for a week to house families from Liverpool whose homes had suffered bomb damage. The school is of brick construction with some sandstone detailing and a slate roof and is a mix of one and two storeys. There is a block to the South-West of the main building which is a mid to late 20<sup>th</sup> century addition and further changes can be seen in the more modern windows to the building and the front entrance extension between 2012 and 2016.</p>			



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
