Description			
<p>A 1930s roadhouse with Tudorbethan motifs and a classical arrangement (i.e. symmetrical centre and wings), with big stacks and hipped roofs. The 1937 proposed plans for the Carr Mill Hotel were produced by architects Richard Owens &amp; Son of Liverpool for Messrs Greenall, Whitley and Co Ltd. These show the hotel with a bowling green to the rear. Further plans show the slab detailings were done by Richard Hill &amp; Co Ltd, reinforced concrete engineers from Middlesborough. The building is shown on an OS map of 1938.</p>

Description			
<p>On 23rd October 1965, the present church was opened, with the glass magnate Lord Pilkington opening the doors for the ceremony of dedication. Though the church hall (to the east) was damaged by a fire in 2018 and subsequently rebuilt, the main church (to the west) is as originally constructed. The site is on a prominent corner plot, set back from the road. The asymmetrical nature of the building, with a fin style projection to the roof, differs from many churches in the borough. The detailed window inserts mirror that of stained-glass windows.</p>

#### Description

A Roman Catholic church dedicated to St Patrick, built in 1964 to the design of F.X. Velarde Partnership and Richard O'Mahony. It is in Brutalist style influenced by Gillespie Kidd and Coia's St Paul's, Glenrothes (1955). The church was built to serve a new housing estate, part of the post-war northern expansion of St Helens. St Patricks Church is a striking modernist C20 church (which closed in 2020) with a concrete frame and constructed from red brick in stretcher bond with a standing seam finish roof. The church's composition is a powerful one comprising of a rectangular plan with two mono-pitched roofs at different pitches. The steeper pitched side has a tall clerestory in the upstand of the steeper pitch as seen by the window stretching across its north west elevation. The associated presbytery and church hall directly respond to the architecture of the church, displaying distinct pitched roof mimicking that of the church. A 2024 planning application was granted for external changes to the church, principally the addition of further windows, to facilitate its use as an educational facility. However, the building's striking character on this corner plot of land remains a key feature within this area.

<b>Description</b>			
St Patricks Hall was built at a similar time to the neighbouring church which was constructed in 1964. It is a striking modernist C20 building of rectangular plan with two mono-pitched roofs at different pitches. The steeper pitched side has a tall window stretching across its south west elevation.
