Description			
<p>The Thatto Heath pub in what was known as Elephant Row was one of the earliest bought by Greenalls, it was included in their 1800 rent book, and the property deeds are thought to date to 1760, not necessarily as a pub, but probably as residence. The original building was demolished in the 1980s. The current Elephant Hotel public house was built in 1903, to the west of the original site. It is a prominent structure in the area comprising a sandstone and brick construction. A tower is displayed to the north-east corner with intricate detailing across the top of the building.</p>

Address	St Austin's Roman Catholic Church, Heath Street, Thatto Heath, WA9 5NN		
Description			
<p>Built in 1895 by Sinnott, Sinnott and Powell. Constructed in brick with paired lancets. The stone tower and front were added in 1905 from designs by the little-known architect E. Quirke. The presbytery dates from 1935. The main body of the church is faced with red brick with sandstone dressings to the window openings, tower and road facing facade. The roof is now covered with concrete tiles.</p>

Address	Nutgrove Methodist Church, Nutgrove Road, Thatto Heath, WA9 5JJ		
Description	<p>Formerly Nutgrove Wesleyan Chapel, this site was built in 1883. Due to the increased demand from local residents for space in the original chapel, initial plans for the new chapel were drawn up by Rev. Mr. Hawkesley, who had apprenticed to be an architect. However this was not adopted and the plans for the building we see today were drawn up by a firm of architects in Bradford. The works were contributed to greatly by the community who assisted financially, through activities such as lecture courses, fruit banquets, concerts and through manual labour, by completing some of the excavations themselves and carting the soil and rock to the heath. Mr Thomas Roberts was the brickwork contractor and Mr Bywater of Pemberton completed the joinery. Altogether including land and architectural fees the building cost £2675.3.3. Rev Josiah Pearson conducted the opening ceremony on 18th October 1883. The imposing structure is entered up a broad flight of stairs under a classical colonnade. It is constructed of soft red brick with extensive sandstone dressings. The 5 memorial stones were laid on 14th December 1882 by councillors; Ed Johnson, C.J. Bishop J.P and R.G. Brook. The further two were laid by Mrs J.H.Lyon and Mrs W Hopton.</p>

This is inclusive of the circular third floor windows over the 2 storey bay windows which form a prominent facade, and the two chimneys.</p>

<p>The architect was Arthur W Bradley (borough engineer). The gazetteer of public libraries in England mentions Sir David Gamble as a co-contributor to the library. Portland cement of British manufacture, brick from the Ravenhead Sanitary Pipe and Brick Co Ltd, facing bricks from Accrington and Tilberthwaite dark sea green slates from Stephenson and Co were used for construction of the building which was noted in detail within the building contract.</p>

Address	The York, 96 Nutgrove Road, Thatto Heath, WA9 5JL		
Description	<p>The York Hotel is thought to have been built in the 1850s by Edward Greenwood. There is an advert for a stone-built pub 'to let' in Brown Edge in the Liverpool Mercury in 1858, with advert saying that plans were available from Edward Greenwood (builder) who according to the 1861 census lived on or next to the site of the current York Hotel. It then appears under the name the 'York Inn' in Slaters Trade Directory in 1869, and the landlord by 1871 is Thomas Barlow. The building is two storeys of stone construction with quoins and displays a slate roof and chimneys.</p>

<p>A sandstone plaque in centre of the building reads '1907 Wesleyan Mission'. The building is of red brick construction with a slate roof. The building has had single storey extensions to the north and south of the building and access ramps installed to the front elevation however the character and appearance of the main section of the building has been retained. The front elevation has two turret like features either side of two large arch topped windows and a central arch topped doorway which has a gable ended porch feature.</p>
