




## Key Differences Between Noticing and Permitting

- Authorisation Required, i.e. permit has to be granted or refused
- Validation Periods
- Actual Start Date
- Phone Call on any unplanned works at all time where traffic control is required
- > No issues with non acceptance of duration challenges
- Cancellations have to be received by 10:00am the day before the actual start date, unless a valid reason is supplied


## **Overall Refusal Reasons**








# Overall Potential FPNs at Cheshire West and Chester Council






# Overall FPN Error Categories at Cheshire West and Chester Council










# Overall Traffic Management Type at Cheshire West and Chester Council


#### No of Accurate Works Stops v Actual Duration - All Work Promoters







#### No of Statutory Cancellation – All Work/Activity Promoters








