


Listed Buildings in St.Helens by Ward

28 March 2012



Listed Buildings are those buildings which are considered to be of special architectural or historic interest, and are included on a national list published by English Heritage. A building must be more than 30 years old and meet certain criteria to be eligible for inclusion on this statutory list.

A listed building is a building, object or structure that is considered of national historical or architectural interest. Every part of a listed building is protected, including the interior and any later alterations or additions. Even if a feature (internal or external) is not included on the official description of the building, it is still protected by the listing.

Listed buildings are placed in one of three grades which give an indication of their relative importance: Grade 1, Grade 2* and Grade 2. Grade 1 and 2* listed buildings are a small proportion (about 6% nationally) of all listed buildings. They are particularly important to the nation's built heritage as buildings of outstanding architectural or historic interest, their significance is beyond dispute. Grade 2 listed buildings include the majority of listed buildings in the country.

There are 146 Listed Buildings (2 Listed Parks & Gardens and 12 Scheduled Ancient Monuments) in St Helens Borough. You can find out if a building is listed using the interactive map or by viewing the records organised by Ward in this document.



DESCRIPTION

Catholic church and presbytery. Church of 1828, with mid C19 apse and presbytery. Stone with slate roof. 3-bay nave with impost band and cornice; pedimented west gable. Round- headed windows have keystones and leaded glazing, and rectangular panels above. West end has windows flanking entrance which has porch with paired unfluted Doric columns, frieze and cornice. Gable has projecting panel with entwined initials. Rectangular apse has paired round-headed lancets and adjoins the presbytery, of 2 storeys and 3 bays. 3rd bay has gable and ground-floor canted bay window with hipped roof. Central entrance has shallow gabled porch.

Farmhouse. Date stone above entrance: "NGM, 1733". Stone with stone slate roof; right return rebuilt in brick. 2 storeys, 3 bays; 1st bay has low gabled wing. 3-light mullioned windows, all except 1st floor window to wing have transoms; drip moulds. Entrance between 2nd and 3rd bays has architrave and segmental hood; 6-panel door with fielded panels, the upper ones round-headed. 3 small brick cross- axial stacks.





House, now Sue Ryder Memorial Home. 1594 for James Anderton. South wing, 1618 for James or Christopher Anderton. Stone with stone slate roof. 3 storeys, 5 bays, all with gables, 2nd and 4th bays project, end bays project further. Gables are coped with kneelers. Most windows have ovolo mullions and label moulds and are of 3 and 4 lights. End bay windows and ground floor window of central bay replaced by C18 windows which are sashed with glazing bars. Entrance to 4th bay has Tudor head. Blocked entrance to 1st floor of 2nd bay with inserted window. South chapel wing has varied fenestration with some hollow-chamfered mullions to ground floor windows. External stair on brick arches to 2nd floor inserted entrance in 1st bay. Interior: remains of priest's hole and secret cupboard, 1st floor stair has turned balusters. Some Tudor arched door heads. C18 fireplace in 1st floor room. A secret printing press operated in the house c.1647, the 1st post-Reformation Catholic press in England.





House now school. Early C19. Stone with slate roof. 2 storeys, 3 bays. 1st floor sill band and top cornice. Windows have flat jambs, wedge lintels and 4/4 sashes. Central entrance has segmental head, inset Doric doorcase and complete fanlight; 3-panel door with fielded panels. Brick end stacks. Right return has some sashed windows with glazing bars. Interior has dog-leg stair with wooden balusters and iron panels.

Barn. 1860s. Rock-faced stone with ashlar dressings; slate roof. Coped gables. Central segmental-headed entrance with barn doors. Large slits with rounded ends. At left end a cow house with entrance with lintel. Roof has trusses with iron tie rods. An unusual example of a farm building given architectural pretension.



Stable and cart shed. 1860s. Rock-faced stone with ashlar dressings; slate roof. 1st bay has C20 openings. 3-bay cart shed has iron columns supporting eaves; roof trusses with iron tie rods. End stable has stone-coped gable. Windows and entrance have lintels. Upper pitching opening with arched head and flanking ventilation slits. End octagonal stair turret has cornice and pyramidal roof with weather vane. An unusual example of a farm building given architectural pretension.





Church. Dated 1718 over entrance; transept dated 1907 by T. G. Jackson. Stone with stone slate roof. 4-bay nave, transept and re-sited apse. Nave has flat Doric pilastrade with lonic entablature; embattled parapet with urns. Round- headed windows have triple keystones and 3-light reticulated tracery. West front has paired pilasters at each end with triglyph frieze above. Doric porch supporting turret with lonic angle pilasters and entablature. Clock face above 3- light straight-headed window with reticulated tracery. Bell housed in cupola on Tuscan columns between 4 urns; ball- finial and weather vane. Entrance has architrave and overlight. North transept has hipped roof and 2 two-light windows; south transept has 4-light window with 2 king mullions and foundation stone. Round apse dismantled and reconstructed in 1907. 3 windows as nave, the central one an insertion. Facade as nave but with balustrade. Wall tablet to Rev. H. Walley (died 1748).





Wall extending approximately 33.5m along west side churchyard and 40m along south side, with canted angle, and 23m to east side, with gates and gate piers to west and south sides. Early C18 with C20 gates. Stone. Wall has weathered coping with top roll moulding. West gate piers have fielded panels with recessed 1/4 columns to angles, Doric entablatures and urn finials. South gate has square piers and ball finials. Inscription on inner side of west wall records grave of J. Liptrot (C18).





Tomb approx. 3 m south of 4th bay of nave. Date of death 1720. Stone, in form of coffin with rings at ends. Upper end of top has low relief curtain with snake encircling winged skull with inscribed ribband above (inscription illegible). Top of curtain bears inscription illegible except for date (probably re-cut). Inscription below curtain records names.

Farmhouse. Dated "JHA 1753" on lintel, attic storey probably later. Stone with stone slate roof. 3 storeys, 3 bays. Windows have plain lintels and C20 casements. Central entrance has flat architrave and C20 door. C19 brick gable- end stacks. Low wall and gateposts with ball finials to front of house. Later low outbuildings adjoin left return. Interior has staircase with turned balusters.





Barn with cowhouses and stable. Probably C18. Stone with stone slate roof. Barn has 3-bay cow house to left and one bay cow house to right of entrance with barn doors. That to left of 3 bays with stone piers to front, now with brick infill and windows and entrance; 4 stalls; shallower pitched roof. That to right has entrance on left return; 2 stalls. Lower, recessed 2-storey 2-bay block to left has elliptical-arched entrance to cart shed with stable (or cowhouse) door and window to right. Windows to 1st floor have remains of frames. Left return has external stone steps, with brick cladding, to 1st floor entrance to ? granary. Rear facade has blocked barn entrance with timber lintel and segmental relieving arch, battered buttress and C20 open shed. Interior:Barn of 4 bays with internal buttresses supporting King post trusses with struts and through purlins. Right hand bay has inserted floor. Stable has tie-beam truss and through purlins.





Farmhouse. Inscription on lintel "TG 1680", 1st floor rebuilt in 1875. Stone with 1st floor of red brick banded with blue brick and with stone dressings; roof now covered with felt. 2 storeys and 4 bays. Weathered base, drip mould over ground floor and similar 1st floor sill band. Ground floor windows of 3:4:3 lights with double-chamfered mullions, transoms and label moulds. 



Church. 1837-8, J. Palmer; chancel of 1914 and top stage of tower of 1938. Stone with slate roof. Gothic Revival. 5- bay nave has west transepts and west tower; chancel has vestry to north. Nave has clasping buttresses and paired lancets between gabled buttresses. Transepts have paired lancets, clasping buttresses and shallow coped gables. West front has lancets flanking tower; pointed west entrance of one order flanked by clasping buttresses, clock face in square panel and octagonal upper stage with louvered bell openings and plain parapet. Chancel has flat buttresses flanking east window of stepped triple lancets. Interior: has west gallery with stair in north transpet, that to south now baptistry. Roof has arch braced trusses with decorative panelling. Chancel has waggon roof and choir stalls with good carving.



C20 entrance to east gable end has cross window above, and plaque: "THE/GERARD/INFANTS SCHOOL/1902". West gable end has 2 brick buttresses and stone stack. 

DESCRIPTION

Catholic Church. 1844-5. By Weightman and Hadfield. Stone with slate roof. 4-bay nave with later narthex, chancel, north vestry and south Orrell chapel (Ritual west is actual north). Nave has 3-light windows with Geometrical tracery between weathered buttresses. North side has small gabled projection at west end with 2-light window. Narthex has straight-headed windows of 2 pointed lights, and Tudor- arched north entrance. Bell cote at east gable end of nave. Chancel and chapel have moulded plinth. Chancel has angle buttresses and 5-light east window with Curvilinear tracery; niche above has nodding-ogee canopy and statue of Virgin and Child. Chapel has 3-light window. Vestry has 2 gabled bays. 


DESCRIPTION

Public house, now house. c.1830. Brick with stone dressings, concrete tile roof. 2 storeys, 3 bays, central bay breaks forward. Stone base, 1st floor sill band, wide eaves and verges; central bay has gablet. Windows have wedge lintels and are sashed with glazing bars; central 1st floor window has pointed arched head. Summary of Building:

Former Pilkington Brothers Limited office building, now converted into flats and business units, 1937-41, designed by Herbert J Rowse and Kenneth Cheeseman. Handmade brick with concrete dressings, flat roof (originally asphalt but now covered with aluminium), horseshoe-shaped plan, Dudokian-influenced Modernist styling. Attached neo-Georgian 1924 block by Sir Arnold Thornely.

PLAN: Horseshoe-shaped plan with a large north range of 2-storeys plus basement that presents a curved north facade to the junction with Canal Street and continues along Grove Street. Attached 1924 block to south-west corner.

EXTERIOR: NORTH RANGE: The range incorporates a deep band of aluminium windows to each floor separated by canted concrete mullions and with concrete sill and lintel bands. Small raised brick decorative motifs exist to the top of the elevation in line with the window mullions below and the basement


level has alternate courses of projecting bricks set in between narrow bands of Lenscrete windows with concrete lintels. An entrance to the north corner containing sliding doors with low zig-zag decoration has a concrete surround and rounded flanking piers with concrete fin motifs that frame a diapered panel above. Similar, plainer and larger entrances exist to the northern ends of the Canal Street and Grove Street elevations, which originally provided vehicular access into the central courtyard. Rising above the rear of the curved north corner is a lift motor room with a projecting concrete roof slab and a multipaned aluminium door to the east side. Set between the ground and first floors towards the southern end of the range's east elevation is large applied white lettering that reads 'REFLECTION COURT'. Set above and behind the roof parapet is a horseshoe-shaped lift motor room with a narrow band of windows to the top, a projecting concrete roof slab and a multipaned aluminium door to the west side.

EAST ELEVATION: On the east elevation facing Grove Street the north range flows in to a series of projections of varying height and the south range. Immediately adjacent to the north range is a tall projection with two sets of four windows to the first and second floor levels on the north face; the lower

ones being set within a ridged band. A taller brick pylon to the left with a curved eastern end rises from an original, single-storey entrance porch below and has three courses of raised brick banding to the top part that incorporate a clock face to each north and south elevation. The building's original main entrance consists of a horseshoe-shaped porch with narrow concrete banding, a projecting concrete roof slab and a high band of windows to the north side. The doorway has a concrete surround and contains sliding doors with a tear drop and zig-zag decoration to the bottom part accessed via a short flight of curved steps. Above the doorway applied blue lettering reads 'PILKINGTON BROTHERS LIMITED'. To the rear right of the porch is a small single-storey, flat-roofed projection attached to the north range, which has a Lenscrete window to the north side and a modern inserted doorway to the east side that now acts as the main entrance for the east elevation.


SOUTH RANGE: The south range lies to the left of the main entrance projections and is of 3-storeys plus basement with a 5-bay east elevation incorporating large aluminium windows to the ground and first floors arranged in continuous vertical strips separated by panels of fluted aluminium cladding and double-height brick piers with decorative concrete fins. Smaller windows exist to the second floor. Attached to the south end of this range is a late C20 red brick extension (not of special interest) of 2-storeys plus basement that wraps around slightly on to the east elevation. The rear elevation of the south range has been re-faced in red brick following the demolition of the earlier Medland Taylor and Rowse buildings but an original

Lenscrete stair window lighting the main stair survives. To the west of this is a late C20 first-floor, red brick extension (not of special interest) supported on tall brick piers.





School building, unoccupied at time of listing (1992). 1911-12 (dated 1911 over doorway), designed as extension to Cowley School (1875-82, by H. Sumners of Liverpool, destroyed by fire, October 1993). Small red bricks in stretcher bond with dressings of buff terracotta, slate roof hipped over main range with wooden belicote. Modified U-plan composed of double-pile main range with short wings clasping a projected ground floor. Edwardian Baroque style. Two storeys, 3:5:3 windows at 1st floor, symmetrical. The projected ground floor is flatroofed, has a moulded terracotta plinth, banded clasping corner pilasters and plain frieze with flat coping; a wide central doorway in an elaborate open-pedimented terracotta architrave which has paired pilasters, a panel lettered A. 1911 D. and swaged cartouche lettered COWLEY SCHOOL; and 3 tall windows each side with terracotta sills and keystones. Behind and above is the school hall, which has 5 large segmental-headed multi-pane windows with moulded terracotta heads and keystones, that in the centre taller and with an open segmental-pedimented architrave; a modillioned cornice and plain parapet run out from the pediment (and carried around the wings); and a hipped roof which has wooden belicote in the centre with geometrical open tracery, a domed roof and tall finial. The wings have clasping corner pilasters, banded open-pedimented gables, 3 windows on each floor with flat-arched heads and an enriched oculus in the gable. Left return wall has a projected 3-window centre with semi-circular open pediment, and modillioned. Rear of common brick, regular fenestration with flat-arched red-brick heads; diagonal singlestorey porch in angle with projecting north wing. Interior not inspected. Formerly linked to the earlier Cowley School building (latterly known as the North Block) by an external corridor.



Said to be dated 1777, with initials of William Cross and wife. Possibly it was an earlier stone barn, altered and extended in C18. Stone base courses, arts of stone walls, and a stone floor. The rest brick, two storeys and basement, with some brick floors, and a stone flag roof over open timber roof, on very thick beams. Some blocked round-arched openings and a long round-arched niche for warehouse entrances on two levels. Some windows segmental-headed, all very small. Interior has very low beamed ceilings, except for top room under the roof. Lower treads of staircase are of stone. Disused. Nos 53 to 59 (odd) form a group with the Malthouse.
