TRACE & TRACK PERMISSION FORM

Since the Government introduced new guidance on gatherings we are now able to allow up to 20 family members/close friends to attend funeral services as of 8th July 2020. Social distancing of 2metres must be maintained and previously agreed principles around minimising attendance remain, restricted to members of the person’s household, family members and friends and attendance of a celebrant of choice, should the bereaved request this. Considerations concerning vulnerable or shielding of people should be made. People showing symptoms of Covid-19 should not attend a funeral service. Those invited to attend a service in the chapel should wear a face covering as per government legislation which came into force from the 8th August 2020 as an additional precaution against infection.

As part of the new guidelines we will be adhering to the new track and trace guidance. Therefore, if we have reports of a covid-19 outbreak at the crematorium and are asked to provide details of anyone who has attended a funeral to the NHS track and trace team. The contact information provided on this form will be passed onto them to assist with track and trace of any persons attending the funeral service. This will be your consent to this information being disclosed to them.
