

FLY-TIPPING

IS A CRIME



Kate used social media to find someone to remove her waste for her and it turns out that they weren't licenced and fly-tipped her waste. Kate was prosecuted and fined £150.

If you are asking anyone to remove and dispose of your waste on your behalf, such as a tradesperson that has carried out some work for you, then you have a responsibility to check that they are a Registered Waste Carrier. Ask for their license number and check it here: <https://environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/view/search-waste-carriers-brokers>

If your waste ends up being fly-tipped and you aren't able to show that you took reasonable steps to prevent it then you could be prosecuted and fined.

Kate will #ThinkTwice before asking someone to remove her waste!
