CREMATED REMAINS SECTION – NEWTON CEMETERY **SECTION 25 & 26**

Each small grave space can accommodate up to four caskets of Cremated Remains. A lease will be granted for a period of 50 years. After the expiry of the lease a further payment may be made to renew the lease.

It must be noted if you purchase a cremated remains grave on these Sections that nothing other than the existing 10-inch border, will be permitted in front of the beam, with the exception of 2 plastic flower flutes or seasonal bedding.

St Helens Council will edge the border and maintain the grass area to a high standard on a regular basis.

Terms & Conditions

These conditions are in place not to restrict the choice of individuals, but to ensure the Council maintains control of the appearance and standards within the Cemetery grounds and to ensure every lease holder is treated in a fair and equal manner.

- No unauthorised plaques, flower containers, memorabilia, Items of personalisation, edgings, stone chippings, etc. are to be placed upon the grave or within the border area apart from the permitted flower flutes.
- Any Items placed upon the grave other than fresh/artificial flowers placed in the headstone flower container or within the permitted flower flutes will be moved and disposed of without prior notice.
- It is important to notify the Cemetery and Crematorium Office of any change of address.
- No extended garden will be permitted on this section of the Cemetery.
- Plastic flower flutes may be placed in front of the memorial (within the border area only).
- If grave owners wish to plant seasonal plants, within the border area, they must notify the Bereavement Services Manager of their intention; these plants must be maintained and kept in good condition by the grave owner. A separate application form will be required for this option.
- Any plants not maintained by the grave owner will be removed by the Council without prior notice.
