Outdoor Set

Ideal group activity to explore the Natural World in any outdoor space with a reference book to extend children's learning on UK wildlife and habitats.

Music and Dance

Ideal for 12+ children using streamers and scarfs to explore dance and movement. Children will benefit from physical activity ideally outdoors in a large social group. Story book also included.



Craft Box

This is an ideal starter pack or to add to resources where childminders meet as a group, includes paper, glue, scissors, crayons, chalks etc



Early Maths

A selection of early maths resources covering sorting, cardinality and shapes including a maths plank. Children will develop their depth of understanding in a small or large group activity.

Nature Bag

Add these natural resources to a container and let children add sand/water to create a rockpool or beach and extend their learning by creating other habitats with the resources included. Collins Seashore reference book included.

BLACK AND WHITE SENSORY PLAY FOR BABIES

This fun two-hour practical workshop will give you lots of ideas for creating stimulating resources and displays which are rich in promoting babies' attention and developing their personal social and emotional attention, communication, language and physical development. Sensory play can create an opportunity for children to work on their own individual skills such as communication and PSED which links with research from the EEF Evidence Store.

High contrasting colours, particularly black and white, are an effective way to stimulate babies' senses and support early brain development. Spaces rich in high-quality displays and resources are necessary for promoting early visual development.
